

## **Additional required reading for CIED 3103 Children and Adolescent Literature**

In addition to the required textbook, *Children's Literature, Briefly* (6<sup>th</sup> ed.), students must read various types of children's books to complete assignments for the course. It is not necessary to purchase these additional books. Instead, students are encouraged to access these books through their local public libraries or other sources.

In the first several lessons, students must access books that fall into broad categories, such as picture books of their choosing. Later, students are required to complete reading logs for four books (three picture books and a chapter book) from each category below. The books selected must be award-winning (see a list of examples of awards for children's books below). And, in lesson 13, students must identify, read, and report on three books that have been frequently challenged and/or banned.
